### • VCU Student Emergency Fund

- Counseling updates accepting new clients next week. They will continue to work with students on appropriate and affordable community referrals if they cannot meet their therapy needs.

#### Dr. Woleben

- Pre-clinical curriculum updates
  - o Online lectures via Zoom sessions have been successful
  - o GI exam went well last week, average score higher than previous years
    - only one student with issues accessing the exam, but they were resolved
  - Planning to continue remote learning until the end of semester for M1s

- No anticipated change in start date for M2 year: July 20th is the return date, will update if there is any changes
- Summer research experiences
  - University is still only allowing virtual/remote experiences
  - Will check in with Dr. Donnenberg about any more information re: fellowship opportunities
- Clinical curriculum updates
  - For rising M3s the start date of M3 year will be based on when the COVID-19 peak in VA would be (while the peak was initially projected in May, at this time it seems to be earlier, towards end of April)
    - We are discussing between mid-June versus July
  - Starting next week rising M3s and M4s will participate in crash COVID course
    - Completed at home at your own pace, for transcript credit
    - Will be composed of online modules, some live Zoom sessions (which will be recorded) as well as couple reflection assignments
  - Series of 2-week non-clinical electives will be available to sign up
    - Topics include ethics, dermatology, child abuse/neglect, advanced anatomy, physiology of COVID-19, geriatrics, basic ICU skills
    - Most will be done at own pace, ~20 hours/week commitment
    - We hope to make these electives available for future classes as well
  - Telehealth and other opportunities being looked into to provide some parts of clerkship/patient care
- The school is looking at Step 2 testing dates modifications and helping students with rescheduling; we will be very flexible about test dates when students return
- Capstone for graduating M4s to start next week
  - o Dr. Ryan will send out more clarifying information
  - Some will be recorded but many sessions require interaction and will likely require attendance with QR code
  - Time zones will be put into consideration for students who are out of state
- Virtual graduation ceremony at 3PM on May 8th; Dr. Kirch will participate via live-stream or a recorded message
- Logistics of individual hooding ceremony being held when students are allowed to return to campus are being discussed, as well as a possibility of a ceremony at 5-year reunion
- Tuition and fee refund -
  - University has sent out refund announcements regarding housing, dining, and parking.
  - SOM is working on providing alternative methods of educational opportunities and at this time not looking into closing the school or providing a tuition refund
    - The tuition of medical school is determined based on the yearly average of cost of all 4 years of schooling, and takes dedicated periods and interview season already into consideration.
