## • Dean Kendall Plagemen

- Student Health Insurance
  - A working group of faculty, staff and students is reviewing plans, led by Dr. Klink.
  - The goal is to identify an affordable plan for students that meets their needs.
  - If a reasonable plan is identified, the goal is to offer it for the Fall 2021
- University Counseling Service
  - Currently providing telehealth services to all enrolled students located within the U.S. until the end of the semester.
  - At the end of the spring semester we will continue to provide initial assessments (RAM's) and brief individual therapy via telehealth (Zoom/phone) to students located within the state of Virginia.
  - Students living outside of Virginia can receive case management consultations to help them find a local clinician.
  - Crisis services will remain available for all students.
  - Services provided during the summer semester are available to students enrolled in summer credits as well as students who intend to be enrolled for the fall semester.

## • Dr. Chris Woleben

- Class of 2024
  - The whole class is set! Deans have been in communication with them
  - May have some virtual meetings with current students to talk about experiences; will reach out to the current student in the next few weeks
  - Currently planning to start the new M1 class on time, at the end of july but have contingency plans such as virtual orientation

#### Class of 2023

- Class averages have been higher than past exams since virtual courses started, M1s will finish their year in ~2 weeks
- Working on developing with the Department of Health to have students involved with contact tracing over summer break since research will not be possible for many students; more information to come next week or so

#### Class of 2022

- Non-clinical element of family medicine clerkship has now begun
- Telehealth and non-clinical aspect of Pediatrics to follow until mid-June
- Current goal is to have rising M3s back around mid to late June.
- The school is working to ensure sufficient PPE supply for student safety
  - Modules in works on PPE don/donoff
  - Questionnaire/attestation on student health prior to returning to clinical settings,
  - Collab with other MCV schools to develop guidelines regarding COVID-19 and student health
- Will give at least 2 weeks, hopefully 1 month, of advanced notice on when students can return
- aware that covid is gonna be with us throughout, and working on guidelines in place as students may run into covid during their training; how far we do the non clinical part of clerkships will depend on when students can safely return;

## o Class of 2021

- Current goal is to have rising M4s back around early to mid-June;
  students will be notified at least 2 weeks (hopefully 4 weeks) in advance.
- Looking at creating 2 week experiences focused on various specialties in addition to traditional 4 week clerkship, starting a dedicated committee within next week
- ERAS deadline most likely delayed for 4 weeks, the potential date is 10/15 or 10/21
- Step 2 planning
  - still hoping NBME will let us administer step 2 exams on campus, waiting for final details
  - NBME recently sent a survey asking for schools' IT contacts, a hopeful sign that NBME is moving forward with that plan

- CS NBME is ramping up testing capacities and is also looking to create regional testing centers (may be in the form of a designated medical school in each state/region)
- AAMC is working very closely with the select early match specialities for an updated timeline
- Changing the AI requirement so that instead of having 1 ward and 1 critical care, students would have 1 AI requirement, to choose among ward vs critical care vs even a combo of both; we will adjust the clinical and non clinical elective length accordingly, to ensure capacity
- We're not accepting any away students, to prioritize our students; this willl apply to a lot of medical schools across the country, but there is no confirmed guidelines on away rotations at this time
- We don't currently anticipate M4 year to be lengthened
- Class of 2020
  - Graduation this Friday
  - Working on ways to get the graduates back on campus for individual hooding ceremony for pictures, as well as a 5 year reunion for the actual ceremony
- Overall the deans appreciate the patience from the students, despite the frequent changes in policies and curriculum, and will continue to best optimize your education
